Dr. Sanders also serves as manuscript reviewer for several organizations and publications, including the esteemed *Journal of Bone and Joint Surgery (JBJS)*.

Prior to joining NationalRad as Partner in 2003, Dr. Sanders had a distinguished career in the United States Air Force. He retired with the rank of colonel in 2003, after having held such positions as vice chair of military radiology, radiology consultant to the Air Force Surgeon General, chairman of the department of radiology at Wilford Hall Medical Center and commander of the 759th Medical Diagnostics and Therapeutics Squadron, amongst many others. In addition, Dr. Sanders has received numerous awards for his service and work and has served as professor (visiting, part-time), Department of Diagnostic Radiology at the University of Kentucky College of Medicine in Lexington, KY.
